



CAPTAIN BERNARD D. DUNN, JR., SC, USN COMMANDING OFFICER, CENTER FOR SERVICE SUPPORT



Captain Dunn received his commission through the Naval ROTC Program at the University of Virginia, where he earned a Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering. Additionally, he earned a Masters in Business Administration from George Mason University and is a graduate of Columbia University's Senior Executive Program.


After serving as a Line Officer in various division officer assignments onboard the USS NIMITZ (CVN-68) and USS GUAM (LPH-9), Captain Dunn was selected for transfer to the Supply Corps. Upon completion of the Supply

Officer Basic Qualification Course, he was assigned as Supply Officer on the USS LYNDE MCCORMICK (DDG-8), and later served an additional afloat supply tour onboard the USS PRAIRIE (AD-15). His shore tours include duty as Branch Head for Logistics Operations, Deputy Chief of Naval Operations for Logistics; Director of the Customer Advocacy Group and Unit Chief for Inventory Management of Passive Electronic Devices, Defense Supply Center Columbus, Ohio; Supply Officer, Naval Station Roosevelt Roads, Puerto Rico; Branch Head Supply, Deck, and Admin Rating Assignments, Bureau of Naval Personnel; Fleet Support Directorate, Naval Supply Systems Command and Customer Service Officer and Physical Inventory Officer, Naval Supply Center, San Diego.

He earned his commission through the United States Naval Academy in 1987 and graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in Math. He has also earned a Master of Arts degree in National Security and Strategic Studies from the Naval War College and a Master of Business Administration in e-Business from the University of Phoenix. In addition, CAPT Titus is also a graduate of the Joint Forces Staff College and has completed the Executive Development

Programs from San Diego State University, Tench Francis School of Business, University of North Carolina - Kenan-Flager Business School, Penn State - Smeal Business School, and University of Pennsylvania - Wharton Business School.

CAPT Titus has served in a variety key leadership positions afloat and ashore, providing him a diverse Navy background and extensive experience in the full spectrum of logistics. At sea, he served as Supply Officer, VFA 146 and Carrier Battle Group Logistics Officer for Desert Storm Cruise, USS NIMITZ (CVN 68); Supply Officer, USS CORONADO (AGF 11); Assistant Supply Officer and Decommissioning Supply Officer, USS SIMON LAKE (AS 33) participating in Kosovo Operations; ACOS for Logistics (N4), ESG-1 participating in Iraqi Freedom and serving as the CJ4/Director of Logistics for the Combined Disaster Assistance Center, Pakistan, for the 6-month Pakistan Earthquake Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief (HA/DR) Mission OPERATION LIFELINE.

Ashore, CAPT Titus has served at Naval Air Station, Lemoore; Fleet and Industrial Supply Center, San Diego; Naval Air Systems Command; Naval Inventory Control Point, Philadelphia; and NATO HQ Supreme Allied Commander Transformation (SACT).

CAPT Titus's personal awards include two Defense Meritorious Service Medals, two Meritorious Service Medals, five Navy Commendation Medals, two Navy Achievement Medals and a number of unit and campaign awards. REAR ADMIRAL MICHAEL J. LYDEN, SC, USN COMMANDER, NAVAL SUPPLY SYSTEMS COMMAND

Rear Admiral Michael J. Lyden became Commander, Naval Supply Systems Command and the 45th chief of Supply Corps, in October 2008. He commands a worldwide workforce of more than 25,500 military and civilian personnel in providing a broad array of logistics support and retail services to U.S. and allied naval forces. As Chief of the Supply Corps, he is responsible for community management of more than 3,500 active and reserve Supply Corps officers and more than 27,000 active and reserve enlisted personnel.



Prior to assuming his current position, RADM Lyden was Director of Supply, Ordnance and Logistics Operations in the Office of Chief of Naval Operations

(OPNAV N41). He came to OPNAV from Headquarters, United States European Command, Stuttgart, Germany, where he served as Director, Logistics and Security Assistance (ECJ4).

Previously, he held two other Joint positions, Commander, Defense Supply Center, Richmond, Va., a field activity of the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA), Fort Belvoir, Va., and as Executive Officer to the Director, DLA.

RADM Lyden earned a Bachelor's of Science degree in Management Engineering from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute and was commissioned through the Navy ROTC program in 1978. He also earned a Master's in Business Administration degree from Harvard University's Graduate School of Business Administration, and is a graduate of the Advanced Management Program at the Kellogg School of Management, Northwestern University.

Afloat, he served as Supply Officer aboard the frigate USS Valdez (FF-1096), and later as Stock Control Officer in the initial crew of the combat stores ship USNS Sirius (T-AFS-8). RADM Lyden completed his sea assignments as Supply Officer of the aircraft carrier USS Carl Vinson (CVN-70).

His shore and staff assignments include duties as Supply Management Instructor, Navy Supply Corps School; Supply and Integrated Logistics Support Analyst, Program Appraisal Division, Office of Chief of Naval Operations (N81); Executive Assistant to the Assistant Commander for Inventory and Systems Integrity, Naval Supply Systems Command; Director, Operations Policy and Integrated Logistics Support Divisions, Naval Aviation Supply Office; Supply Officer, Naval Air Station Whidbey Island, Wash.; head Spares Programs and Policy Branch, Office of Chief of Naval Operations (N41); and as Deputy Commander for Financial Management / Comptroller, Naval Supply Systems Command.
